



2020 Spring freshet: Water levels have returned to normal

Municipality of Pontiac

April 24, 2020 – 2:00 p.m.

What you should know :

- This is a notice informing you that water levels have returned to normal.
- According to recent forecasts by the *Ottawa River Planning Board* (ORRPB), **water levels are now below the minor flood threshold**; which means that the waters have completely receded from the 0 - 2 years floodplain.
- The ORRPB warns citizens however, to remain vigilant since the spring freshet (thaw) is not completely over.
- The Municipality continues to monitor the water levels and is working in partnership with the ministère de la Sécurité publique du Québec (MSP) in order to provide all the necessary means to ensure the safety of the population.
- The Municipality however wishes to remind residents to take the **necessary precautions**:
 - Considering that the government will not allow the opening of shelters for disaster victims due to the Covid-19, citizens are asked to think of a **place where they could to stay** in the event of a flood (family or friends);
 - Follow the recommendations of the ministère de la Sécurité publique du Québec (MSP) to keep you safe, such as **preparing an emergency kit and a family emergency plan**: www.quebec.ca/securite-situations-urgence/urgences-sinistres-risques-naturels/inondation;
 - Check if your **bilge pump** is in good working order;
